

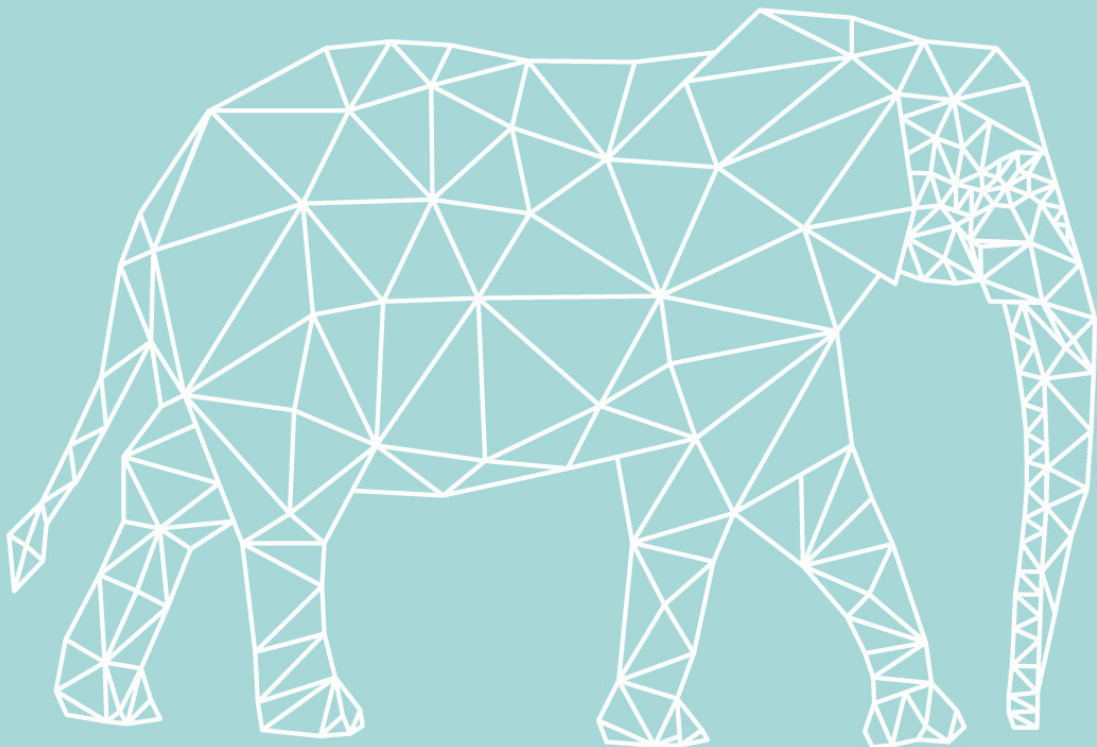

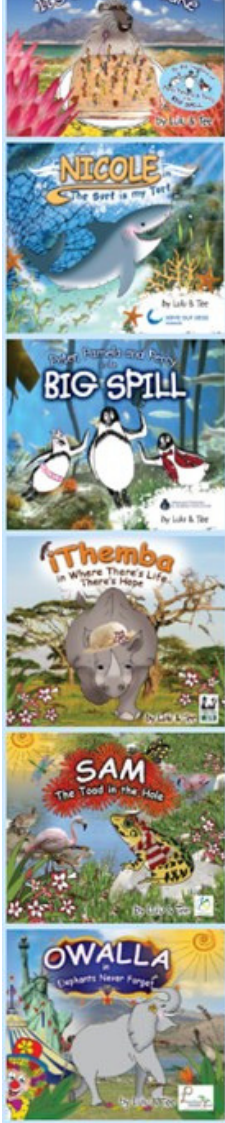

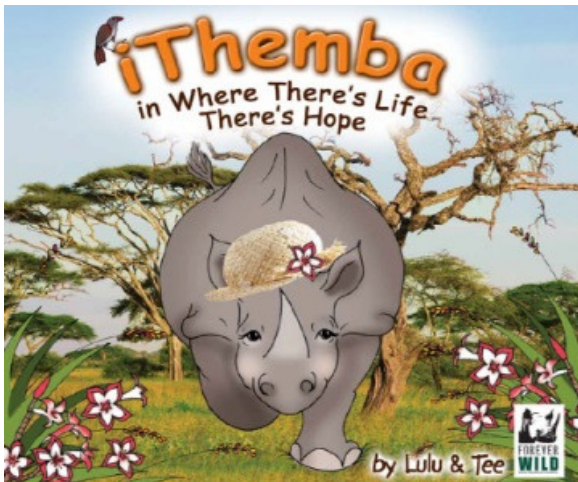

iThemba is the Xhosa word for Hope. With rhino poaching a serious threat to our rhino populations (over 430 rhino were poached in South Africa alone in 2011), it is up to our two-ton heroine, iThemba, and her game-ranger friend Joe, to save her skin - and her horn - when poachers come calling.

Kids will love how iThemba and Joe foiled the wicked horn hunters one dark night in an exciting tale which is loosely based on the real-life arrest of rhino poachers in the Kruger Park, and learning more about these magnificent creatures along the way.

Linda (Lulu) believes children should grow up with conservation in their bones. With Rhino poaching at epidemic proportions and these magnificent creatures threatened with extinction, the race is on to educate children and adults alike.

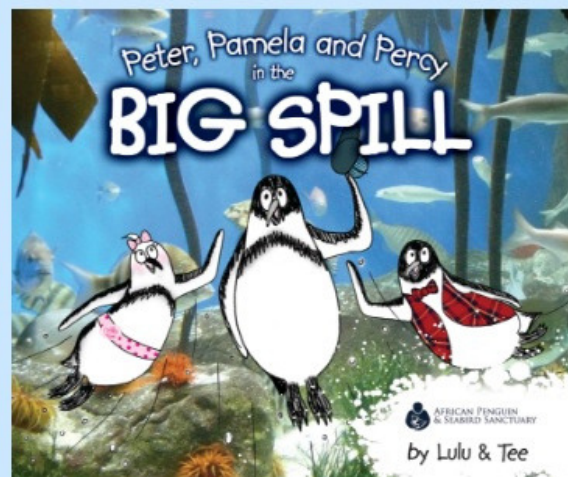

Description:

This book is based on the true story of the ship the 'Treasure' which sank in June 2000 just north of Cape Town causing a huge oil slick that harmed thousands of sea birds. Help came from far and wide in the biggest environmental clean-up operation the world has ever seen - 43 000 penguins were rescued in total. Clean penguins were shipped from Cape Town to Port Elizabeth by truck to swim back to Cape Town to buy time to clean beaches and sea. The whole of South Africa tracked the progress of three rescued penguins, Peter, Pamela and Percy, on their swim back to Cape Town.

About the author:

Linda (Lulu) was involved in the clean-up operation and loved every second of it. It was great to be able to help.

She always believed it would make a wonderful children's story. Years later, when she had her son, she put pen to paper. This was her first children's book.

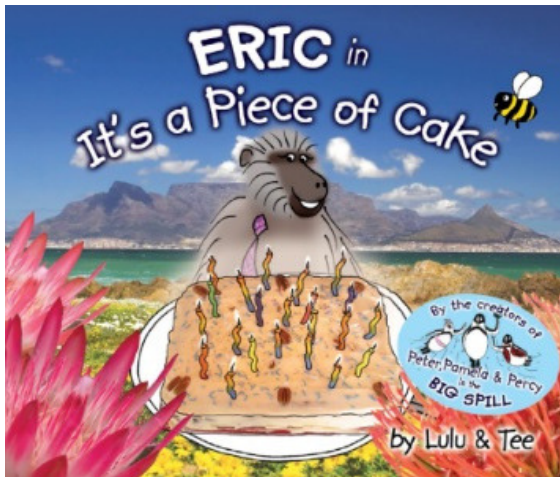

About the author:

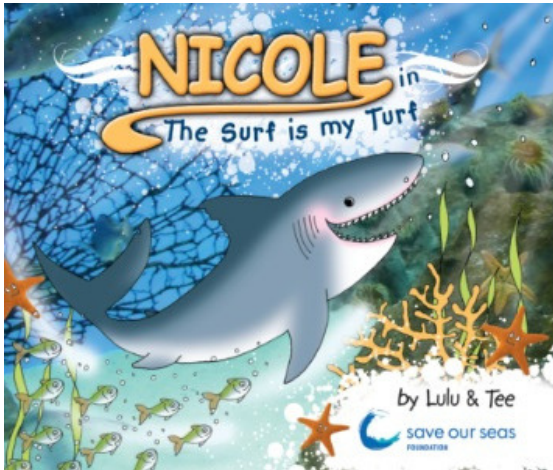

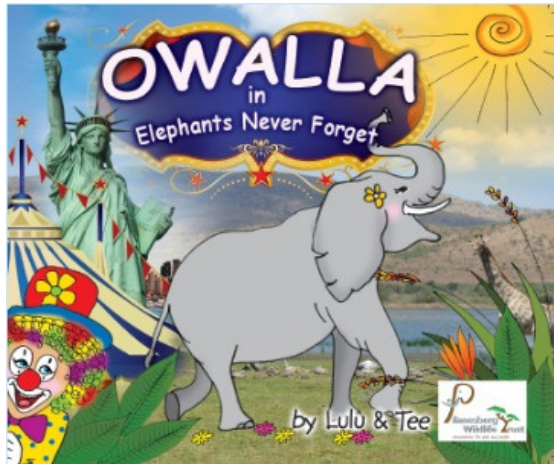

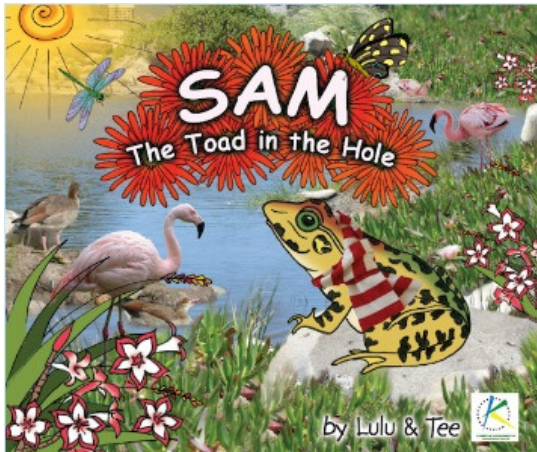

Once an important breeding ground, this humble Cape wetland was filled-in in the 1960s, a disaster for toads and other wildlife. In 2012, a local environmentalist, Wally, was spurred on by Sam, the toad who shared his garden, to save the wetland.
